for Learning helps to make the dream of an education come true for 242 Kindergarten students. In this isolated part of Honduras all the students walk to school and there are no enrollment fees. The chief barrier to affording an education is the cost of the uniform. In a subsistence society the money you earn each day must be used to buy food.

Knowing that your child will receive a filling and

nutritious meal at school provides the needed confidence to invest in a school uniform.

Lunches for Learning currently serves 17 Kindergarten programs. Children as young as four years old may attend these programs. Class sizes range from 2-32 students, each representing a dream for a brighter future. Because of your support, a child is fed and educated and bonds are formed between school, family, and community.

Remember your child's first day of school? For most of us it was a day of anxiety and anticipation. For a five year old in rural Honduras it is a dream that may never come true. According to the Bureau of International Labor Affairs, U.S. Department of Labor, costs such as enrollment fees, school uniforms, and transportation prevents

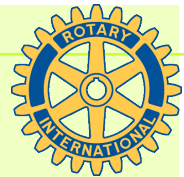
